



Q3 Select the race with which you most identify







Q4 Ethnicity





Q6 What medical degree do you have?






Q8 Your current clinical role: – In your current position, what is the best description of the scope of your current clinical practice—check all that apply:



Q9 Which of the following best describes the size of the community your primary practice is in?





Q10 Is your current primary practice within one-hour travel time of your residency?





Q11 Since you graduated from residency, how many different clinical practices have you worked more than three months in?






Q13 Since finishing your initial residency, have you acquired major new dimensions of clinical/professional knowledge or major new skills that you now use frequently (choose all that apply)





Q15 Did you receive formal education in professionalism in medical school?





Q16 How well did your medical school provide education in professionalism?





Q17 Did you receive any formal education in professionalism in residency?





Q18 How well has your residency provided education in professionalism?





Q19 Overall, how would you characterize your residency faculty's role-modeling in professionalism?





Q20 My practice and/or health system makes it easy for me to be a professional (Choose the best answer)








